Apply to the YMCA

- Those who submit the application documents to YMCA directly :
Please make an appointment beforehand.
We will not accept documents sent by mail.
- Those who submit the application documents to an overseas agency :
Please submit the application documents and have an interview by herself or himself.

In-School Screening / Selection

- Applicants will be accepted based on the results of the screening of application documents and other reviews.

3

Issuing a Certificate of Eligibility

- The result will be informed by mail after the in-school screening.
- An acceptance permit will be enclosed in the same envelope.
- An application for a passport should be submitted to the government organization of an applicant's home country. (Some countries may require an acceptance permit at the time of application.)

Applying at the Immigration Office

- Osaka YMCA Japanese Language School administration office will apply for a certificate of eligibility (visa) at the immigration office for all those who are accepted.
- It usually takes three months for the immigration office to process the application documents.

5

Issuing a Certificate of Eligibility

- When the immigration office grants the application, the certificate of eligibility will be sent directly to the school.
- Then the administration office will send it after confirming the payment of tuition.

6

Obtaining a visa

- Applicants need to apply for a visa, attaching a certificate of eligibility, the letter of acceptance and a passport at the Japanese Embassy or Consulate in their home country.
- It usually takes several days to two weeks to process the application documents.

7

Arrival at Japan / Orientation

- The validity period of the certificate of eligibility is three months after the date of issue.
- Students are expected to arrive in Japan while the certificate is still valid. An orientation and a level test will be given before the course begins.

Class Begins

Osaka YMCA Japanese Language School provides two courses for the needs of the learners.

You will not be allowed to change the course after submitting the application form.

Please be fully aware of the characteristics of each course before applying.

Comprehensive Japanese Language Course

This course enables students to study the Japanese language in a comprehensive and systematic fashion. Students will acquire a higher language skill and communication ability that is required by the Japanese universities including graduate schools, vocational schools, and higher educational institutions. Along with linguistic study, students are given opportunities to learn about Japanese culture, current topics and the Japanese way of thinking and its background.

Besides comprehensive and systematic language studies, students study subjects such as “Japanese Society” and “The World and Japan” as part of a multicultural understanding course.

English is a mandatory subject.

★This is a “College Entrance Preparation Course” approved by the Ministry of Education and Science.

In order to apply for higher educational institutions (universities and vocational schools), applicants must have more than 12 years of school education in their home country. In the case of countries such as Malaysia, Singapore, the Philippines and certain regions of China where school education is less than 12 years, students will be eligible to apply for universities in Japan after completing any of the three different lengths of programs of “College Entrance Preparation Course” approved by the Ministry of Education and Science.

Practical Japanese Language Course

This is a course to cultivate correct and advanced language competence which enables students to deal with various aspects of daily life in Japan such as office, school and home.

While studying practical grammar, students will be able to improve their listening, speaking, reading and writing skills and acquire practical language skill. At the advanced level students can choose elective subjects and work intensively on their target areas of development.

This course is suitable for those who need to improve their Japanese language skill for the purpose of language or job training.

4. Refund

* The selection fee is a handling fee for Osaka YMCA used to make a decision whether or not to accept an applicant. (It is not the fee to apply for the visa.)

Therefore the selection fee is not refundable whether or not an applicant is accepted.

* The tuition is not refundable except in the following cases:

① Before entrance:

- Where the visa application is rejected even though going through the proper application procedure has been followed. Full amount including entrance, tuition and material fees will be refunded.
- Where the cancellation of acceptance is due to personal reasons, the full amount, excluding entrance fee, will be refunded.

② After entrance:

- If a student is accepted by a university in Japan before completion of the Japanese language course and the term parallels with that of university' s, the tuition equivalent to the rest of the term period will be refunded.

* A handling charge of 10,000 JPY will be deducted.

Volunteer and Mutual Exchange

★ Volunteer Tutor System

With the help of a Japanese volunteer tutor, students will be able to brush up on their speaking skill once a week. Students can learn about Japanese culture and their way of thinking and students can talk about their own country in Japanese in a friendly atmosphere.

★ Plenty of opportunities to interact with Japanese people

By participating in volunteer programs organized by Osaka YMCA and visiting elementary schools and junior high schools in the local community, students can enlarge their network and contact with Japanese people.

This is an insurance system originally designed for Osaka YMCA. All students are subject to this insurance.

Osaka YMCA provides a special discount and scholarship to those who are Christian clergymen and NGO and NPO workers who are required to acquire Japanese language for their job assignments.

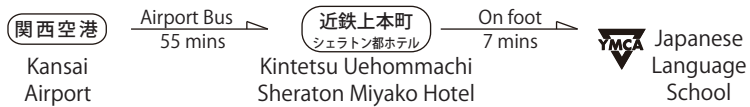

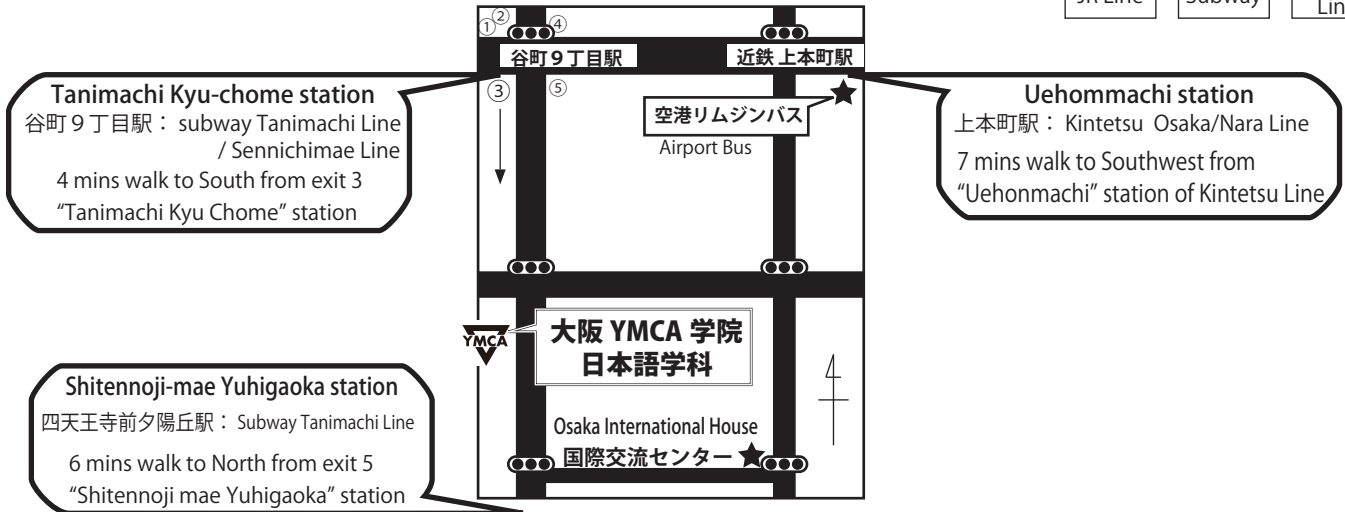
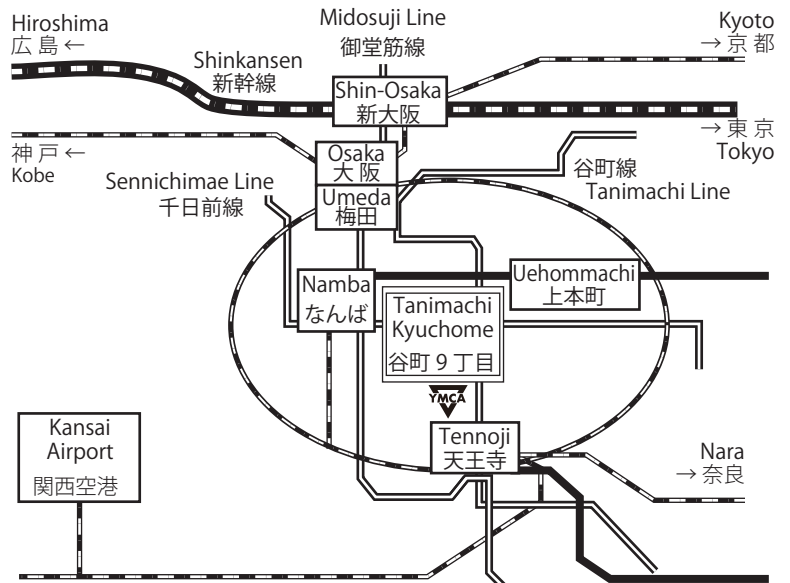
